### **Snow Sculpture Protocols**

Participants: 20 teams of 5 people each, student teams have an additional adult chaperon

- Protocols will be communicated to each team captain via email in advance of the program.
- All staff, volunteers and participants must wear masks while participating, February 9th & 10th. Mask wearing and social distancing will be adhered to at all times (exception of distancing for participants within their own team).
- Assigned volunteers will walk around to do 'Mask Mitigation' by reminding participants and other volunteers to wear masks and stay 6-ft away from other teams.
- All teams must stay 6-ft apart from other teams. Number of teams reduce to ensure spacing.
- Hand sanitizer will be provided at each location.
- Pre-packaged food will be distributed to each team by a volunteer/staff with gloved hands.

### **Exhibiting of COVID-19 Symptoms**

Participants and staff must not participate in the program if sick. If a participant/staff is identified as sick with symptoms of COVID-19...

1. The participant identified to be symptomatic will be isolated away from other participants and sent home as soon as possible.

2. All items/surfaces that the participant may have come into contact with will be thoroughly cleaned using a CDC approved solution; wear gloves and a mask while cleaning.

3. Ensure all others are wearing their cloth or disposable masks and staying 6 feet apart from other groups.

4. If more than one participant has symptoms, the executive director will be consulted to make a plan to contact the local health department.
