



Young at Art Creativity Camps COVID-19 Mitigation Protocols

Facility

The Depot Art Center is currently open for by-appointment gallery visitors only and Bliss Hall is reserved solely for the YAA creativity camps while in session.

Anyone entering the Depot Art Center is advised as follows before entering:

- Avoid entering the facility or location if you have a cough or fever;
- Maintain a minimum six-foot distance from one another;
- Sneeze and cough into a cloth or tissue or, if not available, into one's elbow;
- Do not shake hands or engage in any unnecessary physical contact; and
- Cover your nose and mouth with a cloth face-covering.

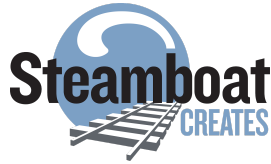
All SC staff, YAA teachers, interns and campers must not come to the facility if experiencing any of the following: headache, sore throat, fever, dry cough, recent loss to taste or smell, shortness of breath, ear aches, body aches, diarrhea, fatigue, vomiting and abdominal pain.

All SC staff, YAA teachers and interns, and campers are screened for COVID-19 symptoms each day, including measuring one's temperature. All teachers, interns and campers are asked to sign a record that the symptom check was completed. All teachers, interns and campers that exhibit COVID-19 symptoms must not come to the Depot Art Center.

Bathrooms, common areas, and other high-touch surfaces are being disinfected frequently throughout each day; and a full clean and disinfecting is conducted between and before/after the morning and afternoon camps.

Drop-off/Pick-up

Guardians are asked to enter the front door of the Depot Art Center, waiting on the designated spots. The YAA intern will take the temperature of the camper and the guardian will answer



health screening questions before signing in their asymptomatic child/ren. A newly disinfected pen will be provided separately for each guardian to sign-in/sign-out.

Conduct

Frequent handwashing upon arrival and before eating for campers and teachers/interns is required. Hand sanitizer effective against COVID-19 is available throughout the day.

All SC staff and YAA teachers/interns are required to wear a cloth face-covering when coming into contact with children or the community. Campers are also required to wear a cloth face-covering whenever they are within 6 ft of someone or indoors (please prepare your camper to wear their face-covering for the entirety of the camp, with maks breaks outside).

Campers are in static groups of 12-15 with one static teacher and one static inter per camp.

Physical cues and table arrangements will be provided to ensure 6-foot social distancing and individual supply kits will be provided for each camper at the start of the week.

This summer there will be no Friday pizza party to avoid gathering a crowd and increasing the risk for sharing germs.

Transportation

Transportation will be limited to as-needed. The number of passengers has been reduced by 50% of the vehicle's occupancy and passengers sit in locations to maximize the distance between one another. All van surfaces will be wiped down after each trip.

Exhibiting of COVID-19 Symptoms

Campers/staff must not come to the Depot Art Center/YAA camp if sick. If a camper/staff is identified as sick with symptoms of COVID-19...

1. The participant identified to be symptomatic will be isolated away from other participants and sent home as soon as possible.
2. All surfaces that the participant may have come into contact with will be thoroughly cleaned using a CDC approved solution; wear gloves and a mask while cleaning.
3. Ensure all others are wearing their cloth or disposable masks and stay 6 feet apart from each other.
4. Participant can return after they are fever-free without medication for 72 hours and 10 days have passed since their first symptom OR they have a clear alternative diagnosis from a medical provider.
5. If more than one participant has symptoms, the executive director will be consulted to make a plan to contact the local health department
